What does SSO / Single-Sign-On mean?

### Solution (public)

SSO stands for Single Sign-On - signing on with your username and password only once, and then being able to use all relevant applications without being asked for a login again.

Depending on where it is used, there is both WebSSO (SSO for web-based applications) and DesktopSSO (SSO for applications on a computer that don't use the browser).

At the moment, the Friedrich-Alexander-University Erlangen-Nuremberg offers only WebSSO.

Each of the integrated applications has both a normal Login link and an SSO Login link. ("Einloggen via SSO" etc.)

You can also reach the system via "<https://www.sso.uni-erlangen.de/>". Using this URL is rather unusual, however, since the relevant login can be found on each page that has been integrated.
